## The RELAX guide wellness hotel criticism

Read here the critical commentary from the Relax Guide for Weissenhaus in Schleswig-Holstein after the standardised hotel test:

Adults preferred (from 12 years). Hideaway of exceptional beauty: 'Private Nature Luxury Resort' is the new name of this family-run property, which is unrivalled - there is no other place like it in Germany! The resort is located in the middle of a 75-hectare park with a castle pond and in front of a two-kilometre-long natural beach. The former summer residence of a royal family is now owned by Hamburg internet tycoon Jan Henric Buettner. He opened it in 2014 after almost 10 years of renovation and has been gradually expanding the extensive grounds ever since. There are now 11 buildings here, including a lavishly restored small castle in neo-baroque style and numerous historic outbuildings.

Rooms are now available in 16 categories (double rooms from 25 to 150 m<sup>2</sup>), and there are also individual houses and villas. Everything is well spread out here, so that privacy is available everywhere in extremely attractive dimensions, even if an event is taking place, as the resort also knows how to cater for weddings and lavish parties. Our favourite is the 'Badehäuschen', which is located almost directly on the beach, has a large garden, outdoor sauna, fireplace and a free-standing bathtub in the conservatory - it doesn't get much better than this.

The spa, which is also open to day guests, is beautifully designed and offers five saunas, an ice grotto and numerous relaxation areas. Outside, there is an almost 13 metre long pool that can also be used in winter, a large saltwater whirlpool and cosy relaxation areas. There is a small daily activity programme, including stretching and visits from the local falconer.

Breakfast is served in the breakfast restaurant Kavaliershaus or on the terrace. The buffet is great and a delight for late risers, as you can enjoy it until midday. Half board is not on offer. You dine in one of the three à la carte restaurants, which outdo each other: There is a Japanese restaurant, the two Michelin-starred fine dining restaurant Courtier - where you can enjoy Christian Scharrer's creations and the view of the colourful natural paradise against a backdrop of original battle paintings by painter Jacques Courtier - as well as the so-called restaurant Bootshaus with a fabulous terrace right on the beach. The cuisine is excellent, the dining culture fairly casual, but there are two seatings.

Present hosts, dedicated and very courteous staff, but no turn-down service. E-bikes and beach chairs (for a fee) as well as bicycles are available, there is also a private cinema. Unsuitable for children. Check-in from 4pm, check-out at 12pm, the spa can be used until 2pm on the day of departure. Valet parking, dogs allowed.
